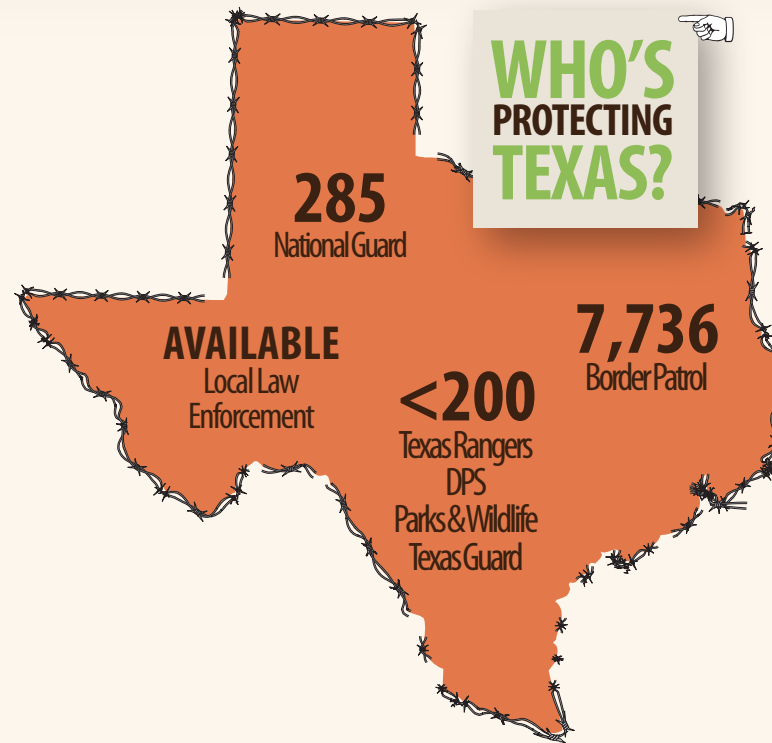


SOLUTIONS

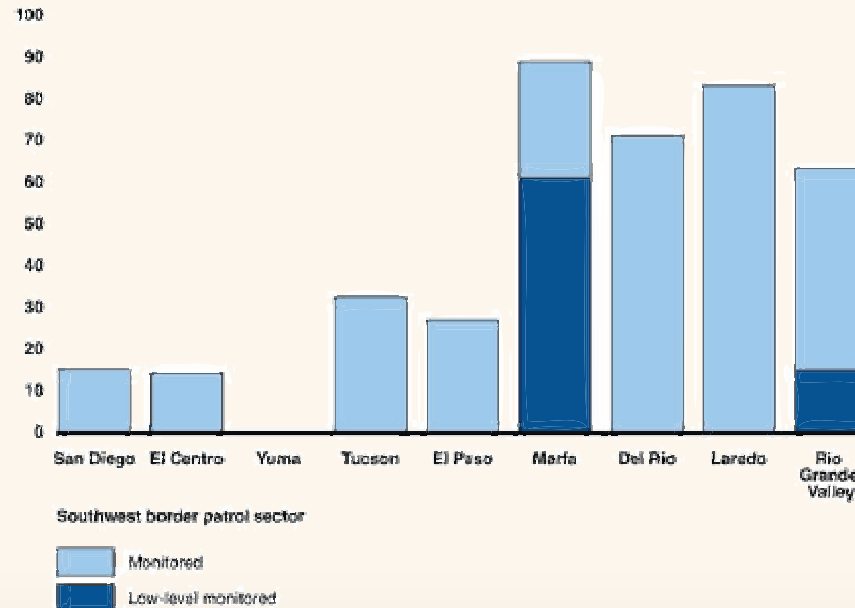
3,000 additional Border Patrol agents

1,000 additional National Guard troops

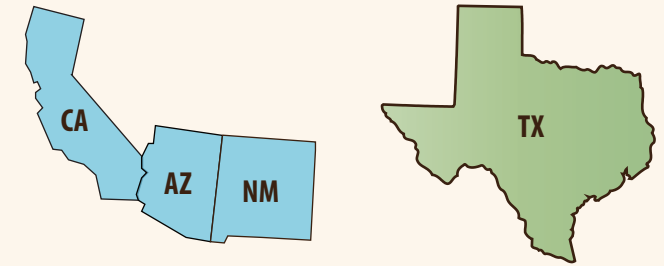


US-MEXICO BORDER NOT UNDER OPERATIONAL CONTROL

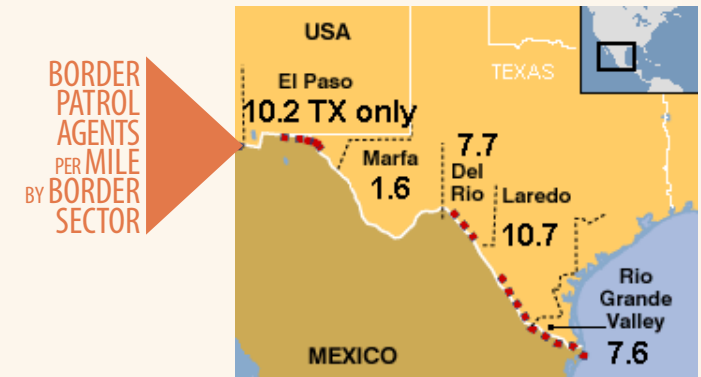
Percentage of miles not under operational control
